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HOT DOCS 2016 TO SHOWCASE 232 FILMS FROM 51 COUNTRIES

23RD ANNUAL FESTIVAL TAKES OVER TORONTO APRIL 28 TO MAY 8

Toronto, March 22, 2016 – Hot Docs Canadian International Documentary Festival, North America's largest documentary festival, conference and market, returns for its 23rd edition from April 28 to May 8, 2016. Showcasing the best in Canadian and international documentary, Hot Docs will welcome filmmakers, industry delegates and audiences to Toronto for the 11-day event. This year's Festival will screen 232 amazing docs from 51 countries, with work by female filmmakers representing close to 40% of the 2016 program.

"This year's Festival is wonderfully curious, and especially adventurous," says Hot Docs executive director Brett Hendrie. "As we present a record number of world and international premieres, we're absolutely thrilled to bring Toronto audiences an incredible diversity of perspectives and ideas from around the globe."

The 2016 Festival will feature 232 official selections and retrospective titles in 12 programs. In addition to screenings, international buyers and industry professionals will attend the Festival to participate in a full slate of conference and market events, including the Hot Docs Forum, Hot Docs Deal Maker and a number of other business and networking opportunities.

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HOT DOCS 2016 TO OPEN WITH WORLD PREMIERE OF LEAGUE OF EXOTIQUE DANCERS

Toronto, March 22, 2016 – Hot Docs is excited to announce that the world premiere of director Rama Rau's *League of Exotique Dancers* (Canada, 2016, 90 min) will open the 2016 Festival with an industry-only screening on Thursday, April 28, at 7 p.m. The film will have a public opening night screening immediately following at 9:45 p.m. Director Rama Rau and subjects Judith Stein and Kitten Natividad will be in attendance at both screenings at the Bloor Hot Docs Cinema, 506 Bloor Street West, to introduce the film and participate in post-screening audience discussions.

"I'm so thrilled that we're opening Hot Docs with a Canadian film this year, particularly one as outspoken and outstanding as *League of Exotique Dancers*," says Hot Docs director of programming Shane Smith. "Not only is the film a celebratory tribute to the feisty, fabulous women who lived, loved and shimmied their way through the golden years of burlesque, it's an empowering declaration that age is a state of mind and sexuality has no expiry date."

Acclaimed director Rama Rau brings a dazzling and daring group of women from the heyday of burlesque out of retirement and onto the big screen in all their feathered and fabulous pasty-wearing glory. League of Exotique Dancers celebrates these pioneers of burlesque as they prepare to give a live performance at the Legends of Burlesque Hall of Fame in Las Vegas. With wit and charm, the performers — a generous and outspoken cross-section of women — happily share their stories from an era when "feminism" was very much an F-word. As a poster in one woman's house proclaims, "Goddesses gather here." But these goddesses faced poverty, racism and sexism and yet all managed to find independence, freedom and strength through the work they did on stage. Featuring remarkable acts, past and present, League of Exotique Dancers is a wonderful tribute to a fierce and inspirational group of women.

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HOT DOCS HONOURS CANADIAN FILMMAKER ROSIE DRANSFELD WITH FOCUS ON RETROSPECTIVE

Toronto, March 22, 2016 – Hot Docs will pay tribute to Rosie Dransfeld with this year's Focus On retrospective, an annual program showcasing the work of a mid-career Canadian filmmaker. Hot Docs will screen five of Dransfeld's films in the Focus On program.

"Sometimes it takes an outsider to show us our own blind spots as a society, and to give a voice to those too often ignored," says Hot Docs director of programming Shane Smith. "Rosie Dransfeld's deeply humane films shine a light on the forgotten and the marginalized, her verité filmmaking sensitively revealing their resilience and resolve. We're excited to be highlighting her rich body of work at Hot Docs this year."

Rosie Dransfeld is an internationally renowned producer and director of feature documentaries. Her films are powerful encounters of the human condition and invite audiences to take another look at reality, balancing on a thin line between laughter and tears. In 2010, her documentary *Broke*. (2009) won the prestigious Donald Brittain Award for Best Social/Political Documentary. Hot Docs programmer Lynne Fernie called Dransfeld a "master of vérité cinema" for her film *Who Cares*, about the gritty and dangerous world of sex trade workers, which had its world premiere at the 2012 Hot Docs Festival. She won the Edmonton Film Prize for *Anti-Social Limited* (2014), a powerful portrait of a self-proclaimed psychopath. Dransfeld also directed and produced *The Ward* (2014), a CBC documentary about life on dialysis. She is currently producing two high profile documentaries as part of *The Transplant Project* for CBC's *The Nature of Things* and the *documentary* Channel. Through ID: Productions, Dransfeld has worked with a wide range of broadcasters, such as CBC, TVO, Knowledge, CTV, OMNI, ARD, ZDF and Arte. Dransfeld's career has been a whirlwind and she is excited to look back and celebrate 15 years of boundary pushing cinema.

FORMER YLE COMMISSIONING EDITOR IIKKA VEHKALAHTI TO RECEIVE DOC MOGUL AWARD AT HOT DOCS 2016

Toronto, January 20, 2016 – Hot Docs will present **Iikka Vehkalahti** with the 2016 **Doc Mogul Award**, which recognizes an individual who, over the course of his or her career, has made an essential contribution to the creative vitality of the documentary industry, both at home and abroad. Former commissioning editor for YLE and current executive producer of IV Films Ltd, Rough Cut Service and Dare To Dream Asia, Vehkalahti will be presented with the Doc Mogul Award at a luncheon in his honour to be held on Monday, May 2, during the 2016 Hot Docs Canadian International Documentary Festival, April 28 to May 8, in Toronto.

"Iikka's dedication to global storytelling and nurturing filmmakers from emerging markets is admirable and invaluable to the documentary community," says Hot Docs executive director Brett Hendrie. "We look forward to celebrating him as our 2016 Doc Mogul."

"It has been a pleasure to witness documentaries emerge as a celebrated global art form throughout my career. Working with filmmakers from Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Middle East and beyond, and seeing these incredible stories get made, often with limited resources, has been very rewarding and fun," says Vehkalahti. "It is an honour to receive the Doc Mogul Award from Hot Docs, who embraces and supports the global documentary community."

Vehkalahti began directing documentaries in 1987 for Finnish production company Epidem, and later at his own company Musafilm. He became the commissioning editor at Finland's national public service broadcasting company YLE TV2 Documentaries in 1998, retiring in 2015. He commissioned hundreds of award-winning documentaries at YLE, including: *The 3 Rooms of Melancholia* (2004), winner of the 2004 Amnesty International-DOEN Award at IDFA; *Recipes for Disaster* (2008); *The Steam of Life* (2010); and *The Punk Syndrome* (2012), winner of the 2013 Audience Award at SXSW. Vehkalahti is a co-founder and board member of non-profit organization STEPS, works closely with AfriDocs, and was one of the series producers for *Why Democracy?*. He served as executive producer for several films produced in Asia, the Middle East and Africa, including all 34 films in the *Steps for the Future* series. He has also been involved with and supported renowned international documentaries such as Oscar®-nominated *The Act of Killing* (2012), *The Look of Silence* (2014), *Armadillo* (2010), *Happiness* (2013), *Placebo* (2014), and *Vivan Las Antipodas* (2011).

Vehkalahti has led training programs, workshops and master classes around the world, and was a visiting professor at the University of Tampere in Finland. Written with filmmaker Don Edkins, Vehkalahti published the documentary filmmaking book *Steps By Steps*. His most recent work includes serving as executive producer for Rough Cut Service, a collective of global editors who provide online support to documentary filmmakers, and Dare To Dream Asia, a series of provocative documentaries about the hopes and frustrations of youth in Asia.
